165.05 A-1 AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT. 1. Uses. This district is established to accommodate areas predominately agricultural in character or undeveloped for urban use. As urban development expands, areas suitable for such use will be rezoned according to the comprehensive plan. A building or premises shall be used only for the following purposes: ... Farm or apiary, not to include storage of livestock or commercial poultry farm

If a nuisance was called: Beekeeping would be a Zoning violation if not done in A-1 District. See Additional Notes.

If bees are not “properly confined,” then an Animal Control complaint could be called for “Dangerous Animals,” or neglectful care, etc.
