

Ramblings from the Russian Bee Guy

Hello and welcome to the October addition of the buzz. The last days of August I was frantically trying to pull the last of our honey from our 300 colonies and get it all extracted. I had gotten the bright idea the year before to book a Canadian fishing vacation to start labor day weekend and that meant all hands on deck the moment state fair ended. It was super stressful, and actually kinda dangerous. I'd caught a heck of a cold at the state fair and was running a fever while trying to pull those heavy supers in 100+ temps. Not even talking heat index, it was over 100 on a couple of the days I was out there pulling. I litterally used my truck as a crutch to enable me to pull those days. Work until I got dizzy and my vision got a bit weird and then hop in the running truck for the airconditioning and down another bottle of water. Those yards took me well over twice the time to pull because of all the breaks, but you do what you gotta do in the bee biz. The one nice thing is that thru honev extraction time. I lost more than 10lbs lol. I might have just discovered a very effective weightloss program lol.

The honey crop this year was really good. I'd thought we weren't going to have much because I did a lot of splitting to take us from 200, to 300 colonies, and I run all those queens too that I break hives apart for. Nope, the hives packed it on. I haven't done the math, but we should be close to last year (which was a record year for our little business). I haven't completed the math because I still have honey in our big holding tank that I need to pour into 55 gallon drums. That tank doesn't have any markings on it, so it's just best-guess on it.

Now that we are back from vacation I'm running around putting treatments on and feeding colonies. The way the bees are "robbey", we must be in a pretty good nectar derth. It won't be too much longer and we'll be into November, so I gotta make sure they are heavy and healthy for their annual California run!



Hello Fellow Beekeepers,

In a few short weeks, the Iowa Honey Producers Association Annual Meeting and Conferences will happen. It will be a great time to learn new things about beekeeping, meeting other beekeepers, and potentially spending some money on the vendors. I am excited to be there and see everyone again.

The Iowa State Fair has officially ended for 2023. It was not as hot as other years which made it nice for everyone. One of the surprisingly popular things (other than the creamed honey) was the honeycomb. It was interesting to see the kids come up to buy it and the parents being skeptical. Maybe TikTok or some other social media fad helped this out? I spent most of my days at the gueen's booth where we rolled many candles and sold lots of honey sticks. I had the opportunity to give nine presentations about beginning beekeeping to how honey is made. One of the recipes that I made in the cooking presentation was the Honey and Lemon Hummus. I personally like exotic food and making this is really easy and a great nutritious snack. The American Honey Princess Allison Hager came for two days and WHO 13 TV crew came to interview her. I was surprised to find out that they are beekeepers too and even had some entries in the Apiary division. The Iowa Pork Queen and the Iowa Pork Ambassador also stopped by to say hello. It was fun comparing our responsibilities and learning about the pork industry. Now, I will say that I did see guite a few politicians (popular candidates for President) but I tried not to get involved in their security and media bubbles. Adult: 16 years and older

- Honey must be one of the sweeteners used
- Can only enter ONE item in each category
- You must supply the recipe (with your name on the back) with your entry
- Contest coordinator will keep the recipes to be included in the "Buzz" newsletter
- Bring enough samples for judging as well as tasting during the Friday Evening Social Sampling before the banquet
- The categories to enter will be:
 - Breads
 - Cookies and Bars
 - Muffins, Cupcakes and Brownies
 - Snacks and Appetizers
 - Sauces, Jams, Jellies and Butters (Items entered in this category must be accompanied by a bite size food item to sample with)
- The Gateway has been gracious enough to allow us to have our cooking contest and bring outside food into the venue. We must follow some simple rules for our social sampling time:
 - a. Food must be broken down into bite size pieces. (After the judging!)
 - b. Drink samples must be in extra small cups. This would be why the above categories were selected.
- Entries will be judged on:
 - 1) Presentation and overall appearance of entry:
 - 2) Best use of honey; and
 - 3) Flavor and texture of entry


